Additionally, on 24 March, National ASMC Executive Director, Al Runnels, announced in an email, "I intend to post updates each week, until I make a decision (in coordination with the National Executive Committee) either to cancel PDI or to definitely conduct it. Right now, I'm highly doubtful (about 85%) that we'll be able to conduct PDI...Should we end up canceling PDI, I'm planning to reach out to speakers to see if some may want to record their presentations, so we can provide perhaps ten, twenty, or more sessions to all DoD and USCG FMers (at no cost) as sort of a 'Partial Virtual PDI 2020.''

Slack

Slack is a freemium (i.e., free but also has premium features for a fee), application centered around group communication. Primary features include channel discussions, direct messaging, group messaging, file sharing, and a variety of app extensions (e.g., Giphy). All of the discussions and conversations are searchable and well organized. Slack can be used via a web browser in most enterprise environments with internet access and as an app on a variety of mobile devices. An important fact about this software, for the government members on this distribution, is that the app is FedRAMP Authorized and can be used by the public sector but PII and FOUO should not be sent.

This is a simple tool that may be particularly helpful in the current environment. Many users may be struggling to keep in touch with their coworkers as they transition to a temporary telework status. Slack can be used to substitute some of the regular informal interactions which occur when we are in the office. It is also a nice way to keep your work group in touch without relying on personal phone numbers and social media.

Coronavirus Scams

As this global event unfolds, please try to not allow thieves to take advantage of any fear or uncertainty you may be experiencing. Ignore any ads or unsolicited offers for virus treatments, preventative measures, supplies which have been in short supply etc. Fact-check any information you come across that is not from a trusted source. Hang up, or ignore, all robocalls and do not push any numbers as this could cause you to be targeted for more calls in the future. Watch for fake communications claiming to be from the CDC and WHO. If you are in a position where you want to support others through donations, verify that you are using a real and reliable organization/site to do so. The FTC has more information.

The Alt Key

The Alt key is one of the best keys on your keyboard that you're probably not using. This is especially true if you like using keyboard shortcuts. Everyone is fairly familiar with the Ctrl key. It allows you to perform a variety of basic functions. The Alt key allows you to do more specific functions as well as navigate a few things quickly.

While you are in a folder, a program window, or even reading an email you can use the Alt key.

When you press the Alt key there are options at the top of the window that should become highlighted. Microsoft Office should also display letters and numbers to make it easier to see. Some programs will underline certain letters.

If you press a letter that is highlighted/underlined then that option will be selected. You can also navigate the options at the top of the window with the arrow keys and press Enter on the option you want.

Example 1: In Outlook, press the Alt button. When you do this the letters F, H, S, O, and V should appear at the top of the screen. Press H, this will select the Home tab in the ribbon. You will see several letters appear. You should see an N over the New E-mail option. Now press N. This will open a new email.

So pressing Alt, H, N will open a new email.

Example 2: In Internet Explorer, press the Alt button. The File, Edit, View, Favorites, Tools, and Help options should appear at the top with File highlighted. Notice the underlined letters in each option. Press H, this will select Help. Each of the options under help will have a letter in them underlined. Press A. This will select the "About Internet Explorer" option.

So pressing Alt, H, A will show you what version of Internet Explorer you are running.

Example 3: This also works for option windows that open in most programs such as the Reminder window that pops up in Outlook when you have a meeting coming up. The Reminder window has several options: Dismiss All, Open Item, Dismiss, Click Snooze to be reminded again in:, and Snooze. So the next time the reminder pops up you can press Alt+O to open the item.

ASMC continues to cautiously plan for the conduct of ASMC National PDI as scheduled from 27-29 May 2020.

Most of the DoD and USCG financial management workforces (as well as those of our ASMC Corporate Members) are out on telework status as our nation continues to drive social distancing practices necessary to overcome this extremely critical situation.
