Use Checkboxes in Windows Explorer

In Windows Explorer, you usually have to hold the Ctrl or Shift buttons if you want to select multiple files (to move/copy/ delete them) that are spread throughout a given folder. If you are not particularly fond of this method, there is an alternative way to do this. You can enable check boxes on the file icons/shortcuts.

To enable the check boxes, press the # button and type "Folder Options" in the search box of the Start Menu. "Folder Options" should be the first result, click on it. This will open the Folder Options window. Go to the "View" tab. This tab will contain a list of settings. Scroll down to the "Use check boxes to select items" option and check it. Press the OK button. Now you will see a checkbox appear when you hover your mouse over a file/shortcut icon in Windows Explorer.

Use of this setting will depend on your preference towards how much you use the mouse or keyboard.

Finding Broken External Links in Excel

Excel does a great job of enabling users to bring together data and content from a variety of sources. Unfortunately, the links generated for these connections can become broken as files are moved or edited. Most users are familiar with the "broken links" message Excel provides when the workbook they opened contains broken links. However, this prompt gives options to edit or disable the links but does not do a great job of informing the user where the broken link is located within the workbook. Below is some information on the most common hiding places for broken links in an Excel workbook based on this article (https://support.office.com/en-us/article/Find-links-external-references-in-a-workbook-fcbf4576-3aab-4029-ba25-54313a532ff1).

The most common source of an external link is when values are pulled directly from another workbook. When Excel references an external workbook, it places the filename in brackets. As a result, the first step in locating external links is to search the entire workbook for brackets or the common part of the Excel file extensions (i.e., ".xl"). Press **Ctrl+F**, to open the Find window and press the Options button where the "search within" option can be changed from the current sheet to the entire workbook. Do a search for ".xl", "]", or "[" to see if there are any direct references to another workbook. Similarly, external references can be located within Named Ranges. Pressing **Ctrl+F3** will open the Name Manager, which lists all of the named ranges within the current workbook and their source.

Conditional Formatting rules may contain an external link in a similar fashion. The rules can be found by clicking on the Conditional Formatting dropdown in the Home tab of the Ribbon and selecting Manage Rules. This window will list all the conditional formatting rules within the selected range or sheet.

Data Validation can also contain external links. Unfortunately, this will have to be checked on a cell-by-cell basis without the help of Add-ins like the Inquire add-in's workbook analysis feature.

Charts and other objects (e.g., shapes and pictures) are another hiding place for broken links. Chart titles and data sources can contain links to external sources and need to be checked individually. Excel's Go To feature can be used to quickly cycle through other objects and see if an external references appears in the formula bar. Press **Ctrl+G** to open the Go To window, select Objects, and press OK. Now all of the objects in the current sheet will be selected. Pressing Tab will enable quick cycling through all of the objects.

Pivot Tables and other data connections can also contain external links. This article (https://www.contextures.com/ excelpivottablesourcedata.html) provides a detailed approach to locating and fixing broken source data links in a Pivot Table.

Search/Find Shortcuts

Press **Ctrl+E** and type what you want to search:

While in a folder in Windows, it will put your cursor in the search box in the top right corner of the window. While in an internet browser, it will let you start typing what you want to do an internet search for. In Outlook, it will put you in the email search box.

Press Ctrl+F and type what you want to search:

While in an internet browser, it will let you search the page you are on for specific text.

While in PowerPoint it will let you search the slide you are on for specific text.

While in a PDF, Word, Excel, or most other text documents will let you search the entire document for specific text.

+S will open the Start Menu search. By default, this will search the Start Menu programs, User files, and the internet. This search feature works even if there is no visible search bar in the Taskbar. Windows will automatically bring up the search bar when you start typing.
