Learning a new system can be challenging, but not if equipped with the right information to help along the way. The Air Force Accounting Operations Center (AFAOC) FM Systems Training Team will assist you with your DEAMS training needs, providing various training platforms and self-help tools to ensure users have the resources needed to succeed. No matter a user's availability or preferred learning style, there is something that works, whether it is hands-on training, live webinars, or web-based training. With the knowledge and experience of the AFAOC instructors, developers, and subject matter experts (SMEs), users will be prepared to accomplish your day-to-day tasks with confidence.

The DEAMS In-Residence training is an in-person, hands-on, course spanning four days. This is the ultimate "New to DEAMS" training, offered quarterly and hosted by AFAOC, located at Wright-Patterson AFB. It is designed for users with little to no DEAMS experience. The goal is to have users fully trained on the basic fundamentals of DEAMS, learn how to navigate the system, and learn the different resources available. **Fun fact for the day:** For a long time, a correlation between playing a song from the 80's on certain 5400-rpm hard drives from around 2005 and hard drive failures had been known. Turns out there is also causation in this case (<https://www.zdnet.com/article/dont-let-janet-jacksons-rhythm-nation-crash-your-old-laptop/>). The song Rhythm Nation by Jane Jackson contained frequencies that happened to also be the natural resonant frequencies of the hard drive disc. As a result, playing this song could cause the hard drive, and hard drives in close enough proximity, to fail.

### **Now Is a Good Time to Update**

Software vendors have been pushing out a variety of updates. This a reminder for you to make sure all of your important devices are set to receive automatic updates and those updates are not being snoozed or delayed. Google (<https://www.zdnet.com/article/microsofts-big-patch-tuesday-fixes-exploited-zero-day-flaw-and-120-more-bugs/>) and Microsoft (<https://www.infosecurity-magazine.com/news/google-patches-critical-android/>) both released large patches this month covering hundreds of flaws and critical vulnerabilities. Apple (<https://www.foxbusiness.com/technology/apple-discloses-security-vulnerabilities-iphones-ipads-macs-hackers-complete-control>) recently identified a patch for a vulnerability that allows full admin access to be obtained on iPhones, iPads, and Macs. Finally, a vulnerability in Realtek RTL819x chips was identified ([https://www.bleepingcomputer.com/news/security/exploit-out-for-critical-realtek-flaw-affecting-many-networking-devices/?web\\_view=true](https://www.bleepingcomputer.com/news/security/exploit-out-for-critical-realtek-flaw-affecting-many-networking-devices/?web_view=true)). This affects a variety of routers including ASUSTek, Belkin, Buffalo, D-Link, Edimax, TRENDnet, and Zyxel. Users will want to ensure that their router firmware is up-to-date.

### **Office 365's Simplified Ribbon**

Older versions of Office, such as Office 2016, allowed users to collapse the ribbon across the top of the screen. Doing so reduced visual clutter and freed up some vertical screen space in the application's window. Office 365 offers a Simplified Ribbon. Instead of collapsing the Ribbon, the Ribbon is more compressed, relying on mostly dropdown buttons and minimal text. To toggle the Simplified Ribbon, click on the downward caret button on the lower-right corner of the ribbon. This article (<https://support.microsoft.com/en-us/office/use-the-simplified-ribbon-44bef9c3-295d-4092-b7f0-f471fa629a98>) provides some images and more details.

### **Office 365 AutoSave**

The AutoSave feature enables Office documents to be saved every few seconds while being edited. As a result, the file is saved as changes are made. This behavior is the same behavior when editing a file within Teams or their web browser. When the file is synced by OneDrive, this feature is enabled automatically. The toggle switch for AutoSave can be found in the upper-left corner of the window for each of the Office apps. If the file that is being edited is not saved to a location synced by OneDrive, stored in a SharePoint library, or saved in Teams then the AutoSave feature will not be available.

### **Office 365 File Version**

When a file is synced to the cloud by being saved to a location synced by OneDrive, stored in a SharePoint library, or saved in Teams then the AutoSave feature will not be available, Version History is available. Version History enables the storage of 25 to 500+ versions of a single file. The number of versions will depend on the settings controlled by your organization. For example, a personal account stores up to 25 versions where most organizations will allow for 100 to 500.

When editing a file in an Office 365 app, the Version History can be accessed by clicking on the document's name at the top of the window. Clicking on the file's name will provide the ability to quickly rename the file, view the file's location, and display the Version History pane. The Version History Pane will display all versions of the file by date. Each version will have an option to be opened. While viewing a previous version, the user will be presented with the option to Restore it. Clicking Restore will make that version the current version.

### **Keyboard Shortcuts for the Office Ribbon**

**Ctrl+F1** will toggle the Simplified Ribbon on and off or toggle collapsing the ribbon depending on which version of Office is being used.

Like most apps, the **Alt** key enables quick Ribbon navigation. After pressing Alt, letters will appear above the Ribbon's tabs and pressing that letter will expand that tab and place letters and numbers on each button within that tab. For example, while composing an email in Outlook, pressing Alt then "H" will open the Home tab and then immediately pressing "A" then "B" opens the Address book.

### **ASMC Membership Dues**

With fiscal year 2022 behind us, we hope you and your organization are pumped for the 2023 fiscal year ahead. Looking ahead, the ASMC team is preparing for trainings and conferences, the commemoration of its 75th anniversary, and more collaboration with chapters as it helps to model defense financial management leadership and growth in the profession.

In order to support our members, chapters, and defense financial management professionals, ASMC is increasing individual membership dues, effective January 1, 2023.

This modest increase in annual membership rates will support ASMC in maintaining and elevating benefits afforded to its members. That includes:

- discounts on educational offerings as well as CDFM certification program and materials, and affinity programs;
- exclusive networking opportunities through chapter affiliation and involvement;
- the opportunity to participate in ASMC's national awards program;
- a complimentary subscription to the Armed Forces Comptroller journal;
- and much more to come!

From now until December 31, 2022 members and non-members may renew or join, respectively, at current rates. Those rates are: \$40 for a one-year membership or \$96 for a three-year membership. In 2023, rates will increase \$10 annually to \$50 for a single-year membership or \$120 for a three-year membership.
